LOVING MY TIME IN OTTAWA: As Canada's capital, Ottawa is the perfect place to experience some of the country's best attractions, celebrations and flavours in one welcoming city. With its unique blend of urban and rural beauty, year-round outdoor activities, and vibrant neighbourhoods, the Ottawa region is best explored over three days or more. Even if you live in Ottawa, I hope you enjoy reading what I have to share.

THE BROOKSTREET HOTEL: Since opening in 2003, the Brookstreet Hotel in Kanata has gained notice as a luxury property renowned for outstanding dining, incredible entertainment, luxurious accommodations, inspired green initiatives and world class golf and fitness facilities. The locale hosts many Jewish weddings and receptions. While in Ottawa we had a chance to visit the hotel, enjoying a delicious lunch on the patio at Perspectives Restaurant. We spent some quality time at the lovely outdoor saltwater pool and I was in heaven in the jacuzzi. When rain cut our date of leisure in half, we were invited back a few days later to resume the pool experience. The Brookstreet has 276 rooms and suites spaced across 18 floors. Plans call for the hotel to build a second tower. There is now some 30,000 square feet of flexible

meeting space, featuring 25 meeting rooms, including three large ballrooms, an outdoor pavilion and the Newbridge Foyer which boasts floor to ceiling glass window. DINING OUT: There are so many wonderful choices for dining out. From my most recent trip, here is my culinary report. The historic York on William (YOW) building, which encompasses Starling Restaurant & Bar and Apothecary Cock-
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Federation CJA, in conjunction with the Jewish community Foundation, provided **\$1,013,850** in funding for food security to help support vulnerable households over the High Holidays and Passover holiday period. This increase in investment towards food security programs to local impact partners helped support **9,215** household interactions over the 2022/23 holiday period allowing families to celebrate with joy and dignity.

to have a vital role to play and merit meaningful support.

These were some of the many issues that preoccupied the lay leadership and staff of Canadian Jewish Congress throughout the last century and into this one. Unfortunately, many of the problems persist albeit in modified forms. It is appropriate then to recall the wisdom of the Sages who declared that we are not obligated to complete the work, but neither are we free to abandon it.
