Maison Fleuries Garden Beautification Contest to include all properties

The Maison Fleuries Garden Beautification Contest has been an annual tradition for years, but, unlike years past where participants had to apply to compete, this time around every property is being judged.

"We've simplified the process this year by automatically entering all gardens into the contest," states the city's website. "You no longer need to register."

The judges have been out touring the city's gardens throughout the month of August, according to David Taveroff, director of Parks and Recreation. He said each political district will have a first-, second- and third-place winner for single-family dwellings. Plus, he said, there are other categories such as religious institutions, seniors' residences, public buildings, apartments/condos, townhouses and duplexes

"There's more of an opportunity to earn prizes because you don't necessarily have to be registered to compete," said Councillor Mike Cohen, who is co-chairing the contest and award ceremony. "The judges are experienced. Most of them have been doing it for a number of years."

Cohen said the judges would already be going up and down the streets to check out participating gardens, but this way eliminates the cost of postage and the time spent on applying.

He said the award ceremony, complete with professional photographs of the winning gardens, is held in the fall and the event has always served as a nice transition into the winter.

"It's amazing how hard people work to produce beautiful gardens, which are beautiful for all of Côte St. Luc," said Cohen. "People really take great care in this."

passenger car seat and turn them into paintings, blur and all."

She has landscapes full of earthy colours depicting scenes *en route* to Lachute and Ottawa. Lone highways take on a surreal aspect where a slight blur conveys movement. Nothing misses her eye or her camera. Jackie Rae has come down to earth, because she started by doing clouds and eventually worked her way "down to the ground," as she puts it.

She has recreated the most famous parts of the Vatican ceiling – not for a religious exhibition, but for a now defunct bar on Crescent St., aptly called The Vatican. Her drawings and paintings of dogs, horses, people, house facades – all private commissions – can be as small as 8 x 10 inches or as large as 4 x 4 feet, and not one of them suffers from a straight static replication.

One of her paintings of the *Mona Lisa* was commissioned by a dentist to be used for his storefront sign. But her Mona Lisa is smiling showing a brand new set of porcelain teeth. It's hilarious.

On a more serious note, she revealed some recent good news: "One of my ROM staircase paintings was purchased by the Rossy Foundation in Montreal for the Colart Collection. It was submitted among 500 artists' entries, and 25 were selected. I was one of them!" (http://colartcollecrtion.com).

She's come a long way since those university days. "I like to make the usual unusual; this creates an element of surprise – the image is slightly distorted but it comes from reality. I believe there is more to what we see than can be seen at first glance. The more we look, the more we can see."
